2009 NOVA SCOTIA HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE - Official



- Ken was born in 1928 in Halifax and played football at Saint Mary's High School.
- At the early age of seventeen, he began his football officiating career, and with Don Loney, Ken formed the original Nova Scotia Football Officials' Association.
- For over thirty years, Ken refereed high school, military and university games and continued as an assigner and evaluator of officials until the late 1990's.
- Ken worked with the AAUA (now AUS) in operating the Atlantic Bowls in the 1970's and 1980's.
- In 1984, Ken was named an Atlantic Bowl Pioneer and received the Award of Merit from Football Canada.

The Nova Scotia Football Officials Association is pleased to announce that one of their founding members, the late Ken Fultz, was inducted into the Football Nova Scotia's Hall of Fame. Ken, along with 15 other Football people made up the inaugural induction class. Ken was the only official inducted and takes his place among other great inductees like former CFL

players Wayne Smith, Terry Baker, Bruce Beaton and others.

Ken was not only a founding member of the NSFOA but also worked with the CFOA and helped write the Redbook, The new Officials training bible for positioning and mechanics. We are very pleased and honored that Ken was inducted into the Football Nova Scotia's Hall of Fame. It is an honor that was long overdue.
